



Hello Parental Units,

I am excited to spend the next 2-3 weeks teaching studying photography. Students will be required to create a portfolio of images displaying particular art and photography elements studied in this time. I will be able to provide students with access to school cameras to complete their work, but many students have asked if they can bring in their own camera. This is not a requirement, but will be helpful in giving students more hands on time to work on their own portfolio. Students do not need to bring in any special type of camera - it just has to be digital and work! I am encouraging students who would like to bring in a camera to label it with masking tape along with the USB cable and bag (if there is one). The cameras will be securely locked and only taken out when it is time to work on their portfolio. Students can either keep the cameras at school until the unit is

done or bring the camera to school on the designated days they will need it. If students do not have access to their own camera I will ensure they are given many opportunities to use the school cameras or share with someone.

If there are any questions or concerns I will be happy to answer them. I look forward to the next 2-3 weeks.
